The Show Low Memorial Ride will be held this year on September 13th. We recommend riders start hydrating days ahead of the ride and carry appropriate hydration with them during the ride as the weather this time of year can still be quite warm. Each participant is responsible for their own actions and abilities. Our rides include city, rural, mountainous, freeway and other environments as well as varied weather and temperatures during the day. Our rides encompass long distances where conditions are subject to change. Please consider your own riding experience and capabilities as well as your vehicle's abilities to keep pace with the group. Passenger cars are just as welcome to join us on the rides as motorcycles.

The Show Low Memorial Ride will start at the Navajo County Peace Officer Memorial, located adjacent to the Show Low City Hall, 180 N. 9th. St. and Hall. We encourage early registration online at https://azfhmr.org/ride-registration/, however registration can be done at the start of the ride. We will have a safety briefing at 9:00 A.M.

The Navajo County Peace Officer Memorial reflects Officers killed in the line of duty in the White Mountain and surrounding areas. We will speak about these officers and some of their stories as time allows. This starting point does a good job of representing those lost in the area and allows us to shorten this ride from years past with greater safety. An additional memorial for the military is immediately next to the Peace Officers' memorial where all five military branches are recognized. We will honor all of those at these memorials with kickstands up shortly thereafter.





The ride will take us east out of town to Concho Valley where we will visit a memorial erected there for DPS Officer Bruce Peterson.



From Concho Valley we will ride to Holbrook and take a fuel/snack break at the Maverik station. This ride takes most of the day and is approximately 175 miles long. We encourage everyone to fuel their vehicles and themselves at this stop.

From Holbrook we will continue west on I-40 to Winslow where we will stop at the Winslow Fire Department where we will talk about the firefighters lost and the challenges that their occupation faces.



Following these memorials our group will meet up with the other northern Arizona rides and continue as one group to the final destination of Go AZ Motorcycles in Flagstaff for our BBQ, raffle and much more.
